What makes an organization strong that has dedicated itself to humanitarian goals and the activities of each individual take place unpaid in their free time?

In addition to the burden of earning a living, every human being is determined by personal demands. There is family responsibility in bringing up children or looking after family members, and with increasing age, reaction capabilities and also resilience are limited.

But time and again there are people who have dedicated themselves to a higher goal. Who not only want to gain something from normal everyday life for themselves, but also want to make a human contribution to the improvement of society. One person alone is the basis for change. But sustainability can only be achieved through cooperation with many like-minded people.

Sometimes we are too single-minded in our commitment and do not even see the interest that others also have in these goals that inspire us. So besides self-discipline, which allows us to do more than the mainstream, communication with others is also important. To intensify this, self-reflection on one's own personality is in order.

There are organizations or companies in this profit-oriented life system, of whatever hue, that ostensibly encourage us in our actions and abuse us in two ways.

Firstly, by no longer experiencing financial support as a benefit for the community but wanting to take personal advantage of it, and secondly, by entering into disfavor with others whom we previously wanted to win over in terms of content.

This is a dangerous cycle and occurs most where social and personal resources are scarce. The venial corruption of the mind and also of lifestyle is not only more common in economically weak systems. Because it is usually not an isolated case, it mutates into normal behavior.

I am addressing this issue in particular because we must succeed in achieving two things:

- 1. Break the ties of sponsors to individuals and transform them into a democratic general funding system that serves those who want to be active but do not hold a position that makes them personally attractive to sponsors.
- 2. To secure funding for our organization and for all those who work to achieve our goals, regardless of individual events.

Education for steadfastness can only succeed if we increase our support for those who depend on our society as a community to pursue goals in a straightforward manner.

This is a challenge to an inhumane society. If we accept this challenge, we can be sure of the gratitude of the patients who put all their trust in our independence.
